Léttleiki means "lightness" and "agility" and describes the harmonious and effortless interaction between horse and rider as well as the form of using a light cues in training Icelandic horses.

Chloe, Aubrey, and I also visited another Icelandic horse farm a little closer to home. Icelandic horses come in all the colors that horses can be and at Chippawa Acres Farm in Dewitt, MI I saw for the first time an all white horse with one small splash of black and sky blue eyes!

And this month we open our barn doors to the second grade students of Gerald Dawkins Elementary School. It is part of our Books and Bridles reading program made possible with a grant from our neighbors at Lake Michigan Credit Union. It pairs riding with reading. Research shows that being on a horse for 25 minutes prepares the brain for learning.
